



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

Alter Ego Sells Again as VLCC Market Booms

The 19-year-old VLCC **Alter Ego**, originally named Yale, has been sold for the **ninth time**, this time by **Cavalli Marine** to **Chinese buyers for \$42 million**. Built in 2005, the vessel once fetched a record **\$170 million in 2008** and has seen action in **Iran and Venezuela**. The deal reflects **surging demand in the VLCC segment**, fueled by **tight tonnage and geopolitical** instability, with vintage tonnage once again proving valuable in a red-hot market.

China's Ship Exports Continue Upward

China exported **590 ships in May 2025**, marking a **6.7% year-on-year increase**, according to the General Administration of Customs. The export value for the month reached **RMB 30 billion (approx. USD 4.2 billion)**—a **significant 18.9% increase** from the same period last year.

Norway Leads with World's Largest Battery-Powered Ships

Norway's Eitzen Group is set to revolutionize the maritime industry by planning the **world's largest battery-powered container ships**. The ambitious project, led by its Eitzen Avanti division, has received a major boost with **\$20 million in funding from Enova**, the Norwegian government's decarbonisation agency.

Enova's latest grant round supports **innovative zero-emission technologies**, and Eitzen Avanti's electric vessel project stood out as a transformative solution for reducing emissions in the **short-sea and regional container trade**. The battery-powered ships are expected to **drastically cut CO**₂ **emissions**, operating without fossil fuels in some of Europe's busiest maritime corridors.

Sokhna Port Hits Record with LNG, Iron Ore & Cruise Traffic

DP World Egypt welcomed three high-profile vessels at Ain Sokhna Port in June 2025: the Energos Eskimo FSRU for LNG upgrades, the Berge Kuju with 180,008 tonnes of iron ore (a national record), and the Aroya cruise ship with 2,300 passengers. These developments demonstrate Sokhna's versatility in supporting Egypt's energy grid, industrial supply chain, and regional tourism growth, while advancing infrastructure through the ongoing \$80 million Sokhna Logistics Park project.





Shanghai Port Achieves First-Ever LCO₂ Ship-to-Ship Transfer



In a global first, Shanghai's **Yangshan Deepwater Port** has completed the **ship-to-ship transfer of liquid carbon dioxide** captured from onboard emissions. The **EVER TOP**, the world's first container vessel with a **carbon capture system**, transferred the LCO₂ to the barge **Dejin** on June 19, 2025. This milestone builds on the ship's earlier ship-to-shore LCO₂ transfer in 2023 and marks a critical step forward in scalable **maritime decarbonization efforts**.

BYD's Auto Carrier Marks New Era

The **Port of Lázaro Cárdenas** received **BYD CHANGZHOU**, the first vessel from BYD's shipping line, unloading **3,503 electric vehicles** at the SSA Mexico-operated terminal. With a capacity of **22,000 net tonnes**, the **200-meter car carrier** is part of BYD's efforts to decarbonize supply chains. The event aligns with regional developments like **CEVA's expanded car carrier services** and **Latin America's first electric tugboat**, reflecting a broader shift toward **sustainable maritime logistics** in the Americas.

Regional News

India's PMI Surges to 14-Month High

India's economy is showing strong signs of momentum as the **HSBC Flash India Composite PMI** rose to **61.0 in June**, a **14-month high**, according to data released by **S&P Global**. This jump from May's 59.3 significantly outpaced analyst expectations and underscores nearly **four consecutive years of private sector expansion**.

This PMI surge reflects India's **resilient domestic economy and expanding export base**, even as global markets face uncertainty. The softening inflation also offers the **RBI more flexibility** to support growth, possibly through **interest rate cuts**.

APSEZ Fuels India's Trade Ambitions

Adani Ports handled a record 450 MMT of cargo this year and aims to reach 1 billion tonnes by FY30. Positioned as India's logistics backbone, APSEZ is expanding beyond ports to offer integrated transport solutions, aligned with the Gati Shakti Mission, and focused on supporting MSMEs and reducing costs.

National Recognition for VOC Port

The VOC Port Authority has been honored with First Place in Cost Management Excellence for 2024 by the Institute of Cost Accountants of India. Awarded in the Transportation and Logistics category, this recognition highlights the port's success in reducing operational costs and improving efficiency. The award was received at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi, by senior financial officials, affirming VOC Port's commitment to sustainable and strategic financial practices in port operations.

India's FTAs with Australia, UAE Drive Export Growth

India's trade ties with Australia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) are reaping significant benefits from Free Trade Agreements (FTAs), particularly through the increased utilization of Certificates of Origin (CoO), which grant Indian exporters access to reduced or zero import duties in these partner countries.

Thinking ahead and moving forward, yet grounded in values that matter.

Tuticorin to Host Major Shipbuilding Hub

The Indian government has chosen Tuticorin, Tamil Nadu, as a site for a 10,000 crore shipbuilding and repair hub, under its mission to become a global shipbuilding leader by 2047. Similar centers are planned in Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat. Under the Make in India initiative, HD Hyundai and Cochin Shipyard are in advanced talks to jointly manufacture large ships, aiming to boost India's shipbuilding capabilities and reduce reliance on global suppliers.

The FTAs with Australia and UAE are strengthening India's export ecosystem, increasing market access for key sectors, improving cost competitiveness, and fostering deeper trade ties. India-Norway Pact - 1st Polar Research Vessel

In a major step for India's maritime science and shipbuilding, **GRSE** and **Kongsberg (Norway)** have signed an MoU to co-develop **India's first indigenous Polar Research Vessel (PRV)**. Presided over by **Minister Sarbananda Sonowal** in Oslo, the initiative supports India's **Make in India vision** and will enable cutting-edge research in the **Arctic and Antarctic**. NCOPR will use the vessel, while India also seeks expanded cooperation and investments in its green and digital maritime ecosystem.



Project Cargo

Hareket Transports World's First Double Boom STS Cranes

Hareket, Turkey's heavy lift and transport specialist, has moved three 2,150-ton Ship-to-Shore cranes - the only double-boom STS cranes in the world-from Haydarpaşa Port to Mardaş Port. Navigating the Bosphorus Strait, the complex operation involved precise engineering, heavy transport, and sea logistics. The cranes, towering at 90 meters and spanning 150 meters, were assembled using two massive crawler cranes. The project highlights Hareket's capacity to manage ultra-heavy, complex logistics.

Precision Turbine Lift in Iraq's Gas Sector



In a complex 21-day operation, a critical 78-tonne modular turbine lift at the Basrah Gas Company's North Rumaila NGL plant in Iraq, using a 600-tonne LR1600 crawler crane. The complex operation - executed between May 22 and June 11, 2025 - improved gas efficiency and emissions control, supporting Iraq's cleaner energy goals. The project improves gas flow efficiency and reduces flaring, supporting Iraq's clean energy transition.

Hybrid-Electric Aircraft Shipped Across Atlantic

In a notable display of sustainable logistics, Heart Aerospace's hybrid electric aircraft prototype was successfully shipped from Sweden to the U.S. aboard a Wallenius Wilhelmsen RoRo vessel, managed by logistics provider GEODIS. The aircraft represents a new era in regional, low-emission aviation, while the shipment highlights the capability of RoRo logistics to support innovation. This milestone aids Heart Aerospace in its prototype validation and certification process and reflects how carriers are adapting to future green industries.

FASCINATING HISTORICAL FACT In the global maritime history

Landsort – Sweden's Pioneering Double – Hulled Oil Tanker

Imagine standing next to a ship as long as three football fields, wider than a 12-lane highway, and powerful enough to push through ocean waves with the strength of 19,200 horses! Meet the **Landsort**, a **Swedish oil tanker launched in 1991**. But this isn't just a giant ship—it's a symbol of change and responsibility on the high seas

The Ship That Changed the Rules

Before Landsort came into the picture, something terrible happened in 1989. A massive oil tanker called the Exxon Valdez hit a reef off the coast of Alaska and spilled millions of gallons of crude oil into the ocean. It was one of the worst environmental disasters in history. Birds, sea otters, and fish died in huge numbers. It was heartbreaking.

To stop anything like that from happening again, the International Maritime Organization (IMO)—which sets safety rules for ships around the world—demanded better ship designs. Landsort was the first large tanker built with these new safety features.

A Double Hull = Double Safety

One of the coolest things about Landsort? She had a **double hull**. That means she had two layers of steel at the bottom and sides—like wearing two raincoats instead of one. If the outer one got damaged, the inner one could still protect the oil inside from leaking out.

And between those two hulls were **wing tanks** filled with water ballast. This helped the ship stay balanced and stable—especially in rough seas.

High-Tech Cargo System

Inside Landsort, the oil tanks were divided into **nine separate compartments**, each with its own powerful pump that could move up to **1,500 cubic meters of oil per hour**! That's like draining **600,000 milk jugs** in just one hour!

Why separate tanks? Simple: If something went wrong in one, the others would stay safe—like having nine treasure chests instead of one big box.



Biggest Rudder in the World (At That Time!)

Here's a fun fact you'll love: Landsort had the **largest rudder in the world** when she started sailing! At **58 square meters (624 square feet)**, it was almost the size of a **two-bedroom apartment**. That huge rudder helped the giant ship turn smoothly—even though she weighed as much as **24,000 elephants**!



Chart of the Month

Global container volumes continued their upward trend in April 2025

Global Container Volumes—Trends & Forecasts



Global container volumes reached **15.6 million TEU**, a **5.8%** increase from April 2024. According to Container Trades Statistics (CTS). March 2025 was the busiest month on record at 16.3 million TEU.

Initial forecasts had predicted flat growth for the year, but actual figures are proving otherwise, especially driven by strong performance in Asia-Europe and emerging market trade lanes.

North America, however, showed clear signs of decline, with imports dropping 4.7% year-on-year and 11.5% from March. US-China trade continues to weaken, with Chinese imports from the US falling by 25% YoY.

It was noted that while all export regions experienced some softening, **Southeast Asia remained resilient**, with year-to-date growth at 7.8%.

Asia-Europe trade rose 8.4% in April, maintaining the momentum seen in Q1, and now sits 9% higher year-to-date.

Other major gains from Asia in April included:

Indian Subcontinent & Middle East: +23%

South & Central America: +24%

Sub-Saharan Africa: +29%

Year-to-date, those same regions posted 15–17% growth, highlighting a shift in global shipping dynamics amid ongoing US tariff uncertainty.

Global Container Shipping Schedule Reliability Improves to 56.3% in May

On-Time Performance - Global Container Shipping



May 2025 marked a strong improvement in global shipping reliability, with schedule reliability climbing to 56.3%, according to latest data—an 8.2 percentage point rise from April and 6.1 points higher than May 2024.

Average vessel arrival delays also improved: late vessels now average 4.2 days late, while the overall fleet saw delays drop to just 1.6 days.

All major trades showed positive trends. The most reliable routes in May were **Mediterranean/Black Sea → South America and North America → South America**. Ten out of eleven major trades posted year-on-year improvements, with overall reliability ranging between 50.1% and 74.1%.

However, blank sailings continue. In weeks 19–22:

- Asia to North Europe saw 6 blank sailings, or 7.0% of its capacity.
- Asia to North America recorded 48 blanks (23.6% of capacity), 17 heading to the East Coast and 31 to the West Coast.
- The **Transatlantic westbound** route saw 3 blank sailings to the US East Coast and 2 to the West Coast.

This performance marks the **best global on-time performance since March 2024**, signaling a potentially stabilizing trend in container shipping.

The Fuel That Powers the Ships

Have you ever looked at a giant cargo ship and wondered what makes it move across oceans? It's not magic—it's **bunker fuel**, and it's a big deal in the world of shipping!


Let's dive into how ships get their fuel, why fuel prices change, and what all this means for the people who run the ships—and maybe, for you one day too!

Bunker Fuel: The Ship's Food

Just like you need food to grow and play, ships need bunker fuel to travel. This special kind of oil powers the engines of massive ships carrying everything from video games and toys to cars and bananas.

There are two main types of bunker fuel:

- VLSFO (Very Low Sulfur Fuel Oil) Clean, expensive, and required by most ships today.
- HSFO (High Sulfur Fuel Oil) Dirty, cheaper, but only legal if the ship has a special cleaning system called a scrubber.



Fuel Prices Go Up and Down Like Waves

From January to June 2025, fuel prices changed a lot. VLSFO went as high as \$658 per tonne and dropped as low as \$558.50. These ups and downs happen because of:

- World events (like wars or natural disasters)
- Oil production changes
- Port supply issues

Smart shipping companies plan ahead, track prices, and sometimes even buy fuel in advance to lock in cheaper rates—just like how you might buy ice cream coupons before prices go up!

What's a Scrubber? And Why Does It Matter?

A **scrubber** is like a giant filter for ships. It cleans the dirty gases that come out of the engine when the ship burns cheaper fuel (HSFO).

Ships that have scrubbers can use the **cheaper HSFO** and still follow pollution rules. Ships without scrubbers must use the **more expensive VLSFO**.

But here's where it gets interesting...



The Scrubber Spread

A Shipping Secret Weapon

Imagine fueling a car at a gas station. You can go for regular unleaded gasoline (typically 87 octane) or premium gasoline (typically 91-93 octane). Though both are great for your vehicle, there is a difference in performance and efficiency apart from the price. That price difference is what we call a **spread**.

In shipping, the **scrubber spread** is the difference in price between VLSFO and HSFO. When the spread is big, ships with scrubbers **save a lot of money**. That's like getting a big discount every day.

In June 2025, the spread was around \$123 per tonne of fuel. Big cargo ships can burn up to 50 tonnes of fuel a day, so that's a **saving of over \$6,000 every day**! Over a year, that's more than enough to buy a small airplane!

Fun Fact Corner!

The port of **Singapore** is one of the busiest bunkering spots on Earth—it's like a giant gas station for ships.

Ships burn so much fuel that choosing the **right port to refuel** can save **millions of dollars** every year.

As the world sails into 2025 with economic uncertainty, shifting global alliances, and technological disruption, Malaysia is quietly charting its course with steady hands and bold vision. The nation stands at a strategic inflection point—powered by resilient domestic growth, revitalized maritime trade, and robust logistics and manufacturing backbones.

In this article, we explore how Malaysia is not just weathering economic headwinds, but preparing to lead regional transformation across sectors—from shipping to semiconductors, from ports to planes.

Steady Economic Winds: Growth Amid Global Uncertainty

Malaysia's economy is expected to grow at a healthy **4.7% in 2025**, riding on the strength of domestic consumption, export activity, and private investments. The fiscal and monetary outlook remains steady, with the Overnight Policy Rate (OPR)

forecasted to hold at 3%, while medium-term bond yields remain stable.

While 2024 closed with a slightly lower-than-expected Q4 GDP growth at **4.8**%, the full-year performance of **5.1**%—up from 3.6% in 2023—signals resilience in the face of global trade tensions, especially from the US and China.

Three regional powerhouses—Johor, Sarawak, and Penang, dubbed Malaysia's "Three Sisters"—continue to drive economic momentum, offering thematic investment opportunities across construction, ports, and digital infrastructure.

The Construction Catalyst: Building the Future

Construction is emerging as one of Malaysia's strongest growth sectors heading into 2025. A robust pipeline of infrastructure projects is expected to translate into order book expansions and rising earnings. These include:

- Penang LRT Phase 1
- Johor LRT/ART projects
- Penang Airport expansion
- MRT3 re-tendering possibilities

The government's USD 20.43 billion infrastructure budget and more than 7,600 development projects are fueling this growth, making Construction one of the top sectors to wavtch in 2025.

After a rollercoaster year in 2024, the **Malaysian ringgit (MYR)** ended the year at 4.4 to the USD. But the outlook is bullish. With the **US Federal Reserve softening its stance** and Malaysia showing domestic strength, the MYR is expected to appreciate to 4.1–4.2 by the end of 2025.

Export-heavy industries that were hurt by forex volatility in 2024 may find smoother waters ahead. Sectors like **consumer goods** and **construction**, which rely on imported materials, are poised to benefit from this currency strength.

Ports, Trade & Progress: The Logistics Revolution

Malaysia's freight and logistics market is undergoing a tectonic transformation.

- Expected to grow from USD 29.7 billion in 2025 to USD 38.28 billion by 2030 at a CAGR of 5.20%.
- Propelled by e-commerce, international trade, and high-tech manufacturing.
- Supported by policies like the National Transport Policy (2019–2030) and investments like the USD 225 million from the Islamic Development Bank.

Port Klang—the nation's maritime titan—handled **14.06 million TEUs in 2023**, and aimed to triple capacity by 2060. Meanwhile, Malaysia's port expansion plans, including **Tanjung Pelepas** and **Carey Island**, signal the country's ambition to rival regional giants like Singapore.

Malaysia is also climbing global rankings, jumping **15 spots to rank 26th** in the **World Bank Logistics Performance Index** (2023).



The Bunkering Boom and Shipbuilding Surge

Malaysia's maritime strategy is entering a high-tide moment. The **Malaysia Shipping Master Plan**, along with the expansion of ports and digital logistics zones, is laying the foundation for the nation to become a major trade gateway.

Key highlights:

- USD 6.34 billion plan to expand Port Klang
- Malaysia ranks 5th in global shipping connectivity (UNCTAD)
- Bunkering services growing rapidly; Malaysia is poised to rival Singapore, the global hub
- LNG bunkering growth aligned with **IMO's low-sulfur fuel** regulations

Specialized ports for oil, gas, palm oil, and timber industries—like **Kuala Linggi International Port** and **POIC Lahad Datu**—further strengthen the ecosystem.

Sector Spotlight

Manufacturing and Aviation

The **manufacturing sector**, contributing 39% of logistics demand in 2024, continues to dominate. Malaysia is doubling down on semiconductors and electronics:

- USD 5.3 billion National Semiconductor Strategy
- 60,000 engineers to be trained
- Exports of electrical and electronic components are expected to hit USD 112.22 billion by 2025

Meanwhile, **Malaysia Airlines** is expanding its fleet with **42 new** wide-body jets, reflecting a strong rebound in global travel and positioning Malaysia as a regional aviation hub.

Malaysia's import activity reflects internal growth drivers, with the **manufacturing sector** taking the lion's share at **84.4**% **in May 2025.**

As of 2024, Malaysia's **poverty rate stands at just 1.4**%, a major social milestone driven by rising private consumption and disciplined inflation control. With consistent GDP growth and visionary national programs, Malaysia is now on track to achieve **World Bank "high-income nation" status between 2028 and 2030**.

Gateway to Global Markets

Beyond ASEAN, Malaysia holds a strategic advantage through its membership in major international trade alliances, including:

- Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC)
- Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP)
- Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP)
- The Commonwealth

These agreements lower trade barriers and enhance Malaysia's connectivity to over 3 billion consumers worldwide.

Smart Cities and Sustainable Innovation

Malaysia is also advancing its Smart City Framework, a national initiative that emphasizes:

- Sustainable urban planning
- Digital infrastructure
- Clean mobility and transportation
- Integration of smart technologies

These developments align with **global urbanization trends**, positioning Malaysia as a lucrative destination for **tech firms**, **green mobility startups**, and infrastructure innovators.

Malaysia's growth was largely supported by resilient **domestic demand**, aided by:


- **Strong household spending,** backed by a positive labour market and income-enhancing policies like minimum wage hikes and revised civil servant salaries.
- Ongoing investment activity, driven by both new and ongoing projects.
- **Moderate but solid import growth**, especially for capital goods—signaling continued momentum in industrial expansion and infrastructure build-outs.

From the **supply side**, growth was led by **services** & **manufacturing sectors**, although performance was moderated by:

- A normalization of motor vehicle production and sales, after several years of high growth.
- A contraction in the mining sector, due to reduced oil and gas output.

What Malaysia Sells to the World: Export Highlights

Malaysia's export landscape in May 2025 saw **electrical** & **electronic (E&E) products** dominate, accounting for **42.4**% of total exports. The export performance offers a clear picture of industry resilience and global demand patterns:



E&E Products remain the bedrock of Malaysian exports, supported by the semiconductor boom and growing global demand for electronics.

Palm oil products continue to perform strongly, with consistent year-on-year growth.

Energy-based exports like **refined petroleum** and **LNG** saw significant declines, suggesting either lower prices, demand saturation, or supply adjustments.

Natural rubber and timber-based products showed notable contractions, underlining shifting global sourcing trends and environmental regulations.





What Lies Ahead: From Vision to Velocity

Malaysia's forward-looking strategies—from **New Industrial Master Plan 2030** to its **Digital Free Trade Zones**, from building bridges with ASEAN partners to reimagining transport connectivity—are not just policy papers. They're engines of real growth.
